Hemlock Woolly Adelgid Informational Seminar!

Hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA; Adelges tsugae) is an invasive insect that has destroyed eastern (Tsuga canadensis) and Carolina (T. caroliniana) hemlocks in much of their North American range. Currently HWA can be found in six Michigan counties along Lake Michigan; Allegan, Benzie, Mason, Muskegon, Oceana, and Ottawa. HWA was recently found in the Nichols Arboretum in Washtenaw County. The State of Michigan and its partners have been working to prevent the further spread of this invasive pest within the state. Robert Miller from the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development will provide information on this destructive pest, Michigan's response efforts and what you can do to protect hemlocks on your property.
